Governor Mifflin School District to welcome two new assistant superintendents

SHILLINGTON, PA – April 4, 2016 – Governor Mifflin School District has announced the hiring of two new administrators to fill the roles of assistant superintendents. The School Board approved the hire of Dr. Elizabeth Lambi to fill the role of assistant superintendent overseeing curriculum and responsibilities relating to secondary students and staff, and Mr. William McKay to fill the role of assistant superintendent overseeing curriculum and responsibilities relating to Pre-K and elementary students and staff. The current assistant superintendent, Mr. Eric Wolf, will retire on June 30 after 37 years of service to the district.

The addition of Lambi and McKay reflects a restructuring of the district administration that allows for the addition of a second assistant superintendent position with a cost-neutral impact on the overall budget.

“Through attrition and retirement, we are able to evaluate the needs of our district and look at leadership in new ways without impacting spending. Reorganizing the assistant superintendent position into two distinct roles, we are going to have a more direct focus on the specific academic and administrative needs at the elementary and secondary levels,” explained Dr. Steve Gerhard, Governor Mifflin Superintendent.

Dr. Lambi comes to Governor Mifflin from the Hamburg Area School District where she has served as the Director of Curriculum and Instruction since 2011. She holds a doctorate in Educational Leadership from Widener University. Dr. Lambi began her career as a Medical Technologist at the Reading Hospital and Medical Center before earning a master’s degree in secondary education from Kutztown University and starting her career in education at Tulpehocken High School. She has worked

in various teaching and administrative roles at Reading Area Community College, Upper Perkiomen School District, and Conrad Weiser School District.

Mr. McKay brings more than 25 years of educational experience to the role of assistant superintendent. He has served as the principal of the Robeson Elementary Center in the Twin Valley School District since 2002. McKay holds a Master of Education degree from Temple University. Prior to his current role at Twin Valley, he served as the assistant principal for Twin Valley Middle School and has also been an adjunct professor at Alvernia University. He has served on a number of professional boards and committees, including the Student Assistant Program, Instructional Support Team, Berks County Elementary Principals Association, and Rock Hollow Woods Environmental Education Center Board of Directors. He has also coached junior high and youth sports.

Both Dr. Lambi and Mr. McKay are scheduled to assume their new roles at Governor Mifflin on July 1, 2016.
